## AL JAZEERA INSTRUCTS LAWYERS OVER EGYPTIAN ARRESTS, ATTACKS AND JAMMING

Al Jazeera Media Network has called in lawyers to take action over the Egyptian Government's campaign against its journalists working in the country.

During the weeks since the overthrow of the Morsi Government by the Egyptian military, a large number of journalists working for Al Jazeera have been arrested and detained by the security services, either without charge or on spurious and politically motivated charges. Al Jazeera offices and journalists have come under attack by the military, the police and unofficial groups supporting the military government, while the network itself has been subjected to a sustained campaign of harassment and intimidation involving the jamming of transmissions and broadcasts, as well as the closure of offices and other facilities.

The behaviour of the Egyptian security services and their supporters towards Al Jazeera, and all journalists who are not linked to the military regime, has given rise to a great deal of concern internationally.

Al Jazeera has now instructed London-based lawyers Carter-Ruck to take action in the international courts and before the United Nations and other relevant bodies to protect its journalists and to safeguard its right to report freely on events and developments in Egypt.

Speaking today, an Al Jazeera spokesman said:

"Al Jazeera cannot permit this situation to continue. The right of journalists to report freely in situations of this kind is protected by international law and is reaffirmed by UN Security Council Resolution 1738 (2006). However, the new regime in Egypt has disregarded this fundamental right and seems determined to silence all
