- An interview with Yusuf Islam, the musician formerly known as Cat Stevens ([“You can’t blame religion for conflicts. It’s a guide,”](#) Oct 25, 2014) might have been understood to suggest that Mr Islam had been ambivalent about extremism among some new Muslim converts, including Britons fighting in Syria. In fact, Mr Islam did make clear his concerns about new Muslims being susceptible to the dangerous influence of extremists who have distorted the religion. We apologise for any distress caused. Mr Islam has also asked us to make clear, and we accept, that while he regrets some remarks he made at the time, he does not support the fatwa against Salman Rushdie, which he believes goes against the principles of Islam. We also accept that Mr Islam has long since made clear that he believes that all people, of whatever faith, must respect and abide by the law of the land.
